Satellite Symposium Speaker: Hugo Kaneku

Hugo Kaneku obtained his medical degree from the Universidad Nacional Mayor de San Marcos in Lima Peru in 2003. He worked as physician at the Peruvian Police outpatient clinic in Lima from 2004-2005 and then moved to Terasaki Foundation Laboratory in Los Angeles where he worked from May 2006 until July 2010. Dr Kaneku has been a post-doctoral research fellow at the University of California, Los Angeles in their Department of Surgery, Division of Liver and Pancreas Transplantation, since August 2010. Dr Kaneku has delivered several oral presentation at conferences. The most recent presentation was at the XIII International Small Bowel Transplant Symposium at Oxford (2013). His presentation focused on 'Donor-specific HLA antibody desensitisation: efficacy and experience at a single intestinal transplant centre'. Also this year, at the American Transplant Congress in Seattle, he delivered a presentation focusing on HLA-DQ mismatch as an independent predictor of de novo DSA after liver transplantation. He has also peer-reviewed and is author and co-author of several publications.
